

3rd & Up:

Math Olympiad Club

Does your child want a little more excitement and challenge from Mathematics other than his/her school course work? Join us in this class with other students who have the same interest. This course is designed for 3rd to 5th graders who are seeking for some math fun by practicing their "math muscle/brain".

6th & Up:

Yearbook Club

SSAT Prep

Kindergarten & Up:

LaughCrafters: Act Up! Improv for Younger Students

Using theater games and exercises to encourage collaborative play, unleash imagination, create fun stories and crazy characters. Quick thinking will be sharpened and confidence will be strengthened as we find the funny together! Taught by professional improvisers from Phantom Sheep Productions.

3rd & Up:

Coding

Do you like puzzles? Are you curious about technology? Learn to code by solving puzzles and creating computer games using visual programming and Lego mindstorm.

5th & Up:

Community Service Club

Open to six grade 5-8 students. Assess student interests and determine which local sites to visit for service from 3:30-4:45 on Tuesdays. Food Pantry, Boys and Girls Club, local elementary school for tutoring, Shriners Hospital, Red Cross, other. Discuss in-house community service projects/initiatives.

Literary Magazine

Come create the first editions of the newly reimagined Snowy Owl Literary Magazine.
